### **Candidates may begin circulating Nominating Petitions January 1 for four open City Council seats in the April 2019 municipal election**

GLENWOOD SPRINGS, CO – The City of Glenwood Springs City Council will have four seats open for the April 2019 municipal election. Mayor Mike Gamba (ward 4) and Councilor Todd Leahy (ward 3) cannot petition for re-election due to term limits. Councilors Steve Davis (ward 1) and Jim Ingraham (at large) can petition for re-election. Councilor Ingraham was appointed by City Council earlier this year after Kathryn Trauger resigned from the at-large seat in February 2018.

Nominating Petitions can be picked up in the City Clerk's office beginning December 28, 2018 at City Hall, 101 W. 8<sup>th</sup> Street, Suite 325. Petitions can be circulated for signatures beginning January 1, 2019. Please note that signatures received prior to January 1, 2019 will not count toward a nomination. Petitions must be returned to the City Clerk's office no later than 5 p.m. on January 21, 2019.

All candidates must be a citizen of the United States, have resided in the City of Glenwood Springs one year immediately prior to April 2, 2019, and be a qualified elector as defined by the laws of the State of Colorado. Candidates running in wards 1, 3, and 4 must reside in the ward for which they are running. Candidates running for the at-large seat can reside anywhere within City limits. All seats will serve a four-year term.

The Glenwood Springs City Council is a non-partisan body of local government. No party affiliation is required to be seated on City Council.
