Chief Wilson began his career in law enforcement as the "dog-catcher" following his work in a local coal mine. He advanced into a patrol officer position and then worked his way through the ranks to Chief of Police.

Chief Wilson stated, "After over 35 years with the Glenwood Springs Police Department, I have decided my last day with the City will be February 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020. In the ensuing months I will focus on completing a couple of projects and assisting the City in their process to select a new Chief of Police.
