ROW TREE CARE ASSISTANCE PROJECT QUICK OVERVIEW:

If you are submitting a **[Right-of-Way Tree Care Financial Assistance Application](#)**, please note that our response time may take approximately thirty (30) days, as we collect applications on a monthly basis and process submissions for prioritization purposes at the end of each month. Please also note that the purpose of this assistance project is to help provide financial assistance for the highest risk trees in our community. Census based socioeconomic data, third-party tree hazard assessment reports, and canopy coverage data are used to help determine what areas and trees are in greatest need.
